Dear friends & members of FPFC, sharing ministry with you as part-time Bridge Pastors since January has been a blessed experience. You have graciously received us into your homes, your worship time, and your lives. Thank you for the trust you have placed in us as we have been privileged to serve our home church in this unique pastoral role. Also, thanks for the opportunity to actually pastor together for only the second time in our 40+ years of ordained ministry. Our original covenant was to serve as Bridge Pastors through March 31. As you are aware, we agreed to extend this ministry with the church through the end of April, then May, and now June is upon us. Like many of you, we look forward to a more relaxed pace for the Summer, when we can have more adventures with our grandson, and visit favorite places with our family. Beginning June 10th, we will relinquish our Bridge Ministry responsibilities.

We are aware that, despite the Search committee's due diligence there is no definite date for an Interim Pastor to begin. Knowing that, we have agreed with the Council to lead worship and preach on June 23, and to occasionally provide pulpit supply for FPFC as we are available. Moving forward, the Deacons and the Called to Care team will provide ongoing pastoral care. We will respond to crisis pastoral care needs at the request of the Deacons. We are committed to continuing our roles as members with Community Outreach, Men's Group and Deacons (Mark) & Christian Education, Called to Care and Pastoral Relations. (Ivy)

Thank you to all those who have pitched in and capably handled more than their usual commitments to the church to assist us and the church during this transitional period. We pray that our church will continue to be faithful in the ministry and mission of this transition at FPFC.


